Submission Guidelines

Authors submitting manuscripts to TMLEG are encouraged to follow the structure below to ensure clarity and readability.

1. TITLE

Provide a concise and descriptive title reflecting the main contribution of the work.

2. AUTHORS AND AFFILIATIONS

List all authors and their institutional affiliations.

Example format:

Author Name1, Author Name2

1 *Affiliation, Country*

2 *Affiliation, Country*

3. ABSTRACT

Provide a brief summary of the research problem, methodology, and main findings (typically 100–250 words).

4. KEYWORDS

Provide 3–6 keywords describing the main topics of the paper.

A paper submitted to TMLEG should typically include the following parts.

1. INTRODUCTION

Introduce the research problem, motivation, and context. Explain the relevance of the work.

2. RELATED WORK

Summarize relevant literature and explain how the present work relates to existing research.

3. METHODOLOGY

Describe the methods, models, or experimental framework used in the study.

4. EXPERIMENTS / ANALYSIS

Present experiments, empirical observations, simulations, or analytical results supporting the study.

5. DISCUSSION

Interpret the results, discuss limitations, and outline possible implications or explanations.

6. CONCLUSION

Summarize the main findings and suggest directions for future work.

REFERENCES

List all cited works using a consistent citation format.

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Interdisciplinary Research

TMLEG encourages interdisciplinary research. Submissions connecting machine learning with other fields such as statistics, physics, philosophy, social sciences, or other disciplines are welcome.
